Up and down season so far

After one of the poorest starts to a ski season in recent years, thanks to unusually warm weather in June, thankfully conditions improved just in time for the July school holidays with some heavy falls.

Perisher, Blue Cow and Guthega are now connected via snow after 28cm of fresh snow this week.

While snow depths remain below what many would hope for at this stage of the season, forecasters are predicting another 45-90cm of snow over the next week. There is cautious optimism that the second half of the season will provide some of the best skiing and snowboarding of the winter.

Share transfer administration fee

All sales of Yalara shares will now incur a \$499 administration fee, payable by the purchaser to Yalara.

The fee has been introduced to cover the administrative costs associated with processing share transfers and maintaining accurate membership records.

Members are encouraged to keep this requirement in mind when negotiating future share sales and to ensure prospective purchasers are made aware of the fee.

Pre-book oversnow transport

Oversnow operator 4SITE has launched a new online booking system this season, designed to streamline the transfer process and reduce waiting times during peak periods.

Staff at the Skitube Terminal office can now scan your booking confirmation directly before issuing your buzzer, making check-in quicker and more efficient.

North Perisher accommodation transfers have also moved to the opposite side of the building to reduce congestion around the terminal, improve traffic flow and minimise interactions between pedestrians, snowcats and other operational vehicles at busy crossings.
